

# **RESOLUTION 103-2001**

**REVISED SECTION 4. FEBRUARY 10 2005**

## **AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO CENTRAL COMMUNICATION**

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the McDonald County Commission that:

**Section 1.** There is hereby created within and for the territory of McDonald County, a Central Communications Department.

**Section 2.** McDonald County Central Communications Board: There shall be a six-member board of directors known as the McDonald County E 9-1-1 Board. The initial board of directors shall be appointed by the McDonald County Commission, and shall thereafter be elected to serve three year terms, with two elected each year. The function of the board shall be to set out in the Missouri Revised Statutes, and they shall also provide management advice and recommendations to the County Commission. This includes, but is not limited to, finances, technical equipment, building and grounds, MULES/NCIC, and general administration.


**Section 3.** MULES Committee: The MULES Committee shall consist of the Sheriff, representing the Sheriff's Department, and two other Chiefs of Police from police agencies located within incorporated city limits of towns and McDonald County. The MULES Committee shall have direct management input into:

- a) The priority of service provided to User Agency by Central Communications.
- b) The standards for election, supervision, assignment, and removal of personnel employed by Central Communications to manage, supervise, or operate the interface to the MULES/NCIC computer.
- c) Policy covering the selection, maintenance, and separateness of that portion of the equipment used by the Central Communications to store, process, and transmit data to/from the MULES/NCIC computer.
- d) Selection and approval recommendations to the County Commission for hiring of the Central Communication Administrator.

**Section 4.** The Central Communications Center shall perform all duties required for the dispatching of emergency response calls within the County of McDonald and such other entities as the County Commission may from time to time direct. For emergency calls direct to the Sheriff's office, deputies may be dispatched immediately as required by the Sheriff's office and the caller will be transferred directly to 911. The caller will be directed to call 911 immediately if disconnected on the transfer of the call. This organization shall follow the Standard Operating Procedure Manual as written by the Administrator, approved by the MULES Committee, approved by the Central Communications Board, and adopted by the County Commission.


